



For the four weeks ending with February 19, the Gospel lessons come from the Sermon on the Mount. First we have the Beatitudes in Matthew 5:1-12. These tell us what God's Kingdom looks like as it comes to us. As chapter five wraps up, Jesus tells us how we bring God's Kingdom others.

In the Beatitudes, Jesus says: "blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled." These words are true because our ways are not God's ways. If we were already in a system that looked like God's Kingdom, righteousness would already be here, and no one would need to hunger and thirst for it.

We are called—not just to hear and receive, but also to speak and act—in ways that will bring in God's Kingdom. We can do things that will show others how God would have us live. Walter Wink, in his book *Jesus and Nonviolence: a third way*, explains. One example is:

"if anyone forces you to go one mile, go the second mile." (Mt 5:41). The only person who would "force" you to go one mile was a Roman soldier. The law was clear. The Roman soldier could force you to carry his pack one mile, but

no further. So to carry it the second mile would bring God's Kingdom into that Roman soldier's world, and cause a lot of trouble for him. In going the second mile, you are showing the soldier just how oppressive his actions are. If it is wrong to force a second mile, it is wrong to force the first mile. So it is with each of the commands. These are not commands to be passive, but commands to point out oppression without opposing it openly (which would have gotten you thrown into jail).

Jesus' words are all about bringing God's Kingdom into this world, here and now. First God's Kingdom comes to us, and then we are sent to bring it to others.

- 2) Providing hospitality to our neighbors
- 3) Concern for people living in poverty and struggling with hunger
- 4) Seeking justice and peace for all people

Any legislation that will be in any of these categories will be followed by the people in that office and then will be related to us via email. You will need to contact the Advocacy office to register your email address so that you will receive the information regarding the legislation that is impacted by any of the above listed priorities.

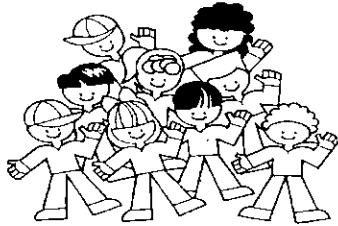
Take care

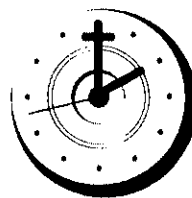
Hunger facts
